PALE YELLOW IRIS

The Eastern Irrigation District has confirmed the presence of Pale Yellow Iris (*Iris pseudacorus*) along the north shore of Lake Newell Reservoir. This prohibited noxious invasive plant can displace native vegetation, disrupt wetland ecosystems, and is toxic to livestock if consumed. We are working with the County of Newell to assess the affected areas and plan management actions for spring. If you suspect this plant elsewhere within the District, please take a photo and report the location through the Newell Connect app. Community awareness and reporting are vital in helping protect our irrigation system and natural areas.

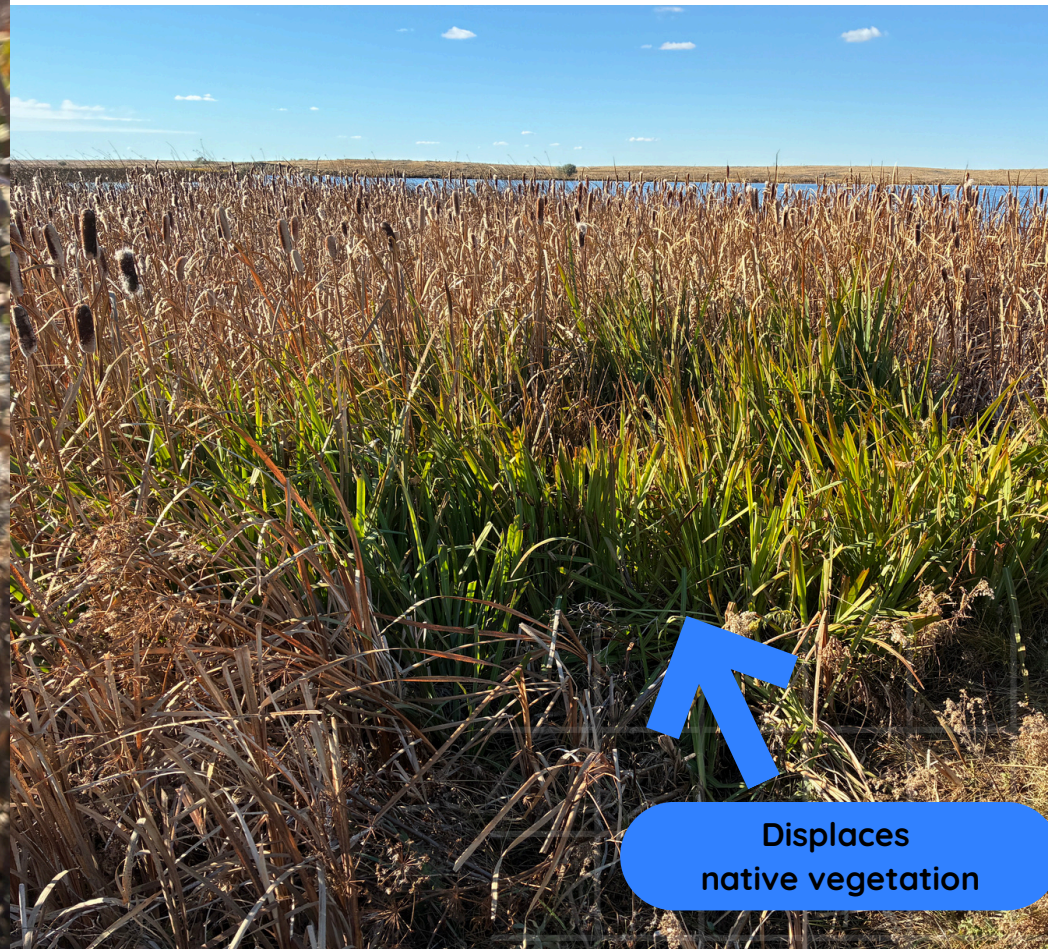
